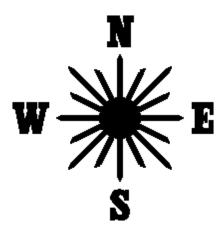

7.1.2 ROAD GRADING PROGRAM

The Yearly Grading Program has been included to enable Council to follow the progress of the grading crews working throughout the Shire. Any changes will be presented on a monthly basis.

7.1.3 RESART NSW, WATER SECURITIES FOR REGIONS

The project is progressing in accordance with required timeline with the exception of provision of high voltage electricity works at Ivanhoe. In this regard, Darling Irrigation have advised of a June deadline as earliest start date because of accredited sub-contractor and transformer availability. Staff are disappointed with this late emergent issue and will be holding further discussions to expedite the matter.

ACE Drilling have been subject to voluntary administration and liquidation processes and therefore will have no further involvement with White Cliffs Groundwater Investigation project.

Council engaged ACE Drilling Pty Ltd in December 2015 to complete a test bore at White Cliffs pursuant to funding received under the Restart NSW Water Security For Regions Program. ACE Drilling Pty Ltd ceased to exist as an operating entity in February 2016 prior to any works commencing and/or payments being made and in accordance with legal advice Council sought fresh quotations for establishment of a test bore at White Cliffs on 1st April 2016.

Fresh quotations were sought from Watsons Drilling, Watermin Drillers and the Impax Group for drilling the test bore (up to 150mm diameter) to a depth of 250m, develop test bore and undertake pump testing, and record keeping including completion of Forms A's. All works will be required to be carried out in accordance with NSW DPI Water, Codes, Guidelines and Specification, and the National Specification, "Minimum Construction Requirements for Water Bores In Australia".

The quotations closed on Friday, 8th April 2016 at 2.00pm.

Watsons Drilling's quotation was the lowest cost and satisfied Council's expectations with respect to experience and ability to do the work in a timely manner. All quotations were within budget constraints. Watson Drilling are expected to commence work by mid-May 2016.

7.1.4 RESTART NSW, REGIONAL WATER AND WASTEWATER BACKLOG

The scoping reports have been finalised and distributed to all stakeholders. The scoping reports have been forwarded to NSW DPW to provide a brief including cost to complete the next step in this augmentation process i.e. completion of option studies for Wilcannia, Ivanhoe and White Cliffs respectively.

The direct engagement of NSW Water Solutions is favoured at this time because of straightforward engagement arrangements (not subject to tender), familiarity of State government requirements and commitment to Councils timelines (completion by June 2017).

NSW Water Solutions will attend site, conduct inspections of existing infrastructure, consult with stakeholders and provide options reports for Councils consideration.

7.1.5 FIXING COUNTRY ROADS

Expressions of Interest were called and Central Darling Shire Council made a preliminary submission with respect to upgrading a Section of the Wool Track (MR 416) pursuant to the Fixing Country Roads Program in December 2015. The upgrade proposal was limited to a 5km section of road identified for the highest priority works.

Council was subsequently invited to submit a full application for the subject upgrade proposal with a comprehensive Benefit-Cost Analysis supporting the upgrade in addition to other project selection criteria. Discussions were held with Transport NSW (Freight Strategy and Planning) concerning the details and scope of the full application and the importance of meeting the programs specified BCR requirements. The discussion concluded that the proposed project had negligible chance of providing the BCR returns required and would not have the support of the Technical Panel undertaking assessment of all applications. The main reason for the insufficient economic returns is the "piece-meal" (staged) approach to the upgrade of the Cobar-Ivanhoe Road. A similar position was held by NSW Transport with respect to a similar application within the Cobar Council LGA.

NSW Transport encourage Council to concentrate its efforts in making a joint submission with neighbouring Councils concerning the entire length of The Wool Track. Preliminary discussions have been held with Cobar Shire Council Acting General Manager at the recent FWI meeting at Wentworth who was supportive of the joint approach.

Therefore, it is proposed that the current application process with respect to the Fixing Country Roads Program not proceed and that Council pursue the potential for a joint submission with neighbouring Council(s) for the whole of The Wool Track.

7.1.6 REMOTE AIRSTRIP UPGRADE PROGRAMME (RAU) ROUND 3

Call for quotations for the fencing of Menindee and Ivanhoe airstrips closed Friday 8th April 2016, Council received three quotations for works. Bids were competitive and assessment identified separate fencing contractors for the Ivanhoe and Menindee projects. Purchase Orders have been raised accordingly and works are programmed to be completed by June 30 in accordance with funding requirements.

7.1.7 COBB HIGHWAY – EURALLA INTIAL SEAL PROJECT

Council commenced early culvert works on Tuesday 23rd February 2016. Council staff and local contractors prepared and built side-tracks around six culvert locations in preparation of replacement of old piped culverts with new culverts and headwalls.

Workers purportedly breached the minor works review of environmental factors assessed footprint which has resulted in the project being halted. Council has subsequently addressed all non-conformances and updated all applicable plans and submitted to RMS for review. RMS have advised that further appropriate project specific conditions are also being developed and will be supplied to Council ASAP so all plans can be adjusted accordingly. Recommencement dates will be advised in due course.

The Environmental Protection Licence (EPL) is being developed by RMS. Council, as the Contractor, will be required to submit the document once completed. Initial advice from RMS predicts a 60-day turnaround for processing pending no additional information is required.

7.1.8 WILCANNIA SEWER PUMP STATION - HOOD STREET

Council experienced further surcharge issues at the subject sewerage pump station over the weekend of 2nd/ 3rd April 2016. Mechanical and electrical issues resulted in one pump being run manually until electrical contractors repaired the faults on Monday 4th April. The surcharge incident was reported to EPA as required.

The EPA were advised that in addition to the immediate remedial works completed, the details of the long term solution needed to be considered.

In this regard, in principal agreement has been reached with the Aboriginal Housing Office concerning the procurement of the vacant allotment at the corner of Hood and Field Streets for a new sewerage pumping station.

Discussions with NSW Water Solutions are in progress with respect to detailed design and construction of a new sewerage pump station addressing any surcharge risk (enhanced capacity, building provision, independent electrical/power options and other best practice requirements.)

7.1.9 ROADS REPORT

The purpose of this report is to update Council on the roads expenditure to date.

- 2015/2016 RMCC works estimated cost for Routine Maintenance Works on both highways is \$740,000.
- 4 Works Orders (WO) have been received to date totalling \$1,133,398. The 4 WO received are; 111.16.01 Sh21 Shoulder Grading \$16,591.52, 111.16.02 Sh8 Heavy patching \$214,911.71, 111.16.03 Sh8 reseals \$683,147.45 111.16.04 Sh21 reseals \$141,724.68 and 111.16.05 Sh21b gravel resheet \$200,157.68. Total \$1,256,533.04
- Euralla Initial Seal Project RMS have provided Council with 4 Works Orders relating to the Cobb Highway project 111.16.06 Water Supply Works \$39,169.80 111.16.07 Water Supply Works \$17,588.40 111.16.08 Gravel Pit Registration \$36,124.53 and 111.16.09 Culvert Works \$349,827.72. Total \$442,710.45

Water & Sewerage Maintenance:

- Wilcannia town water supply is being sourced from the Darling River Weir Pool. Catchment rainfall finally reached the Darling River at Wilcannia over the weekend of the 12/13 March. The estimated weir pool supply is up to 4 months. Wilcannia remain at Level 2 water restrictions effective from Monday 15th February. Operatives have completed minor R&M works and pump tests on the bore infrastructure in preparation of use of the emergency bore. Water restriction in Wilcannia were lifted Monday 14th march 2016.
- White Cliffs town water supply is sourced from above ground tanks, current levels: Tank 1 =3.8m, Tank 2 =3.4m, Tank 3 (Wakefield) = 4.1m. Estimated supply remaining is 5 months. Recent algal blooms in Wakefield tank has resulted in the town being sourced from tank 1 and 3 only. White Cliffs remain on Level 2 water restrictions effective from Monday 15th February.
- Ivanhoe town water supply is currently being sourced from the Morrison's Lake reservoir. Morrison's Lake storage is currently 250 megalitres, town storage dam 55 megalitres. Estimated supply remaining is 9 months.
