
## General Manager Greg Hill to leave Central Darling

This new model was introduced by the Minns Labor Government to address the unique challenges of larger remote councils and to provide a pathway back to democratic representation for Central Darling Shire after 12 years of administration.

The three appointed councillors were determined by the Minister after the election results were declared, to ensure their skills and experience will complement those of the elected councillors.

The Council Administrator Bob Stewart will be the Chairperson for the new Council and will continue to provide strategic direction for the Council. The Council can elect a Deputy Chair at its first meeting in December.

Councillors will undergo an induction program to ensure they are ready and equipped to serve the people of Central Darling.

#### **News in brief**

White Cliffs moved from Level 3 water restrictions to Level 4 restrictions on Monday 27 October 2025. This is because of drought conditions, limited above ground storage and minimal rainfall expected. People are asked to minimise their water usage.

#### **Urban and Rural Addressing**

A reminder to residents that Council has moved to the new legal addresses. This means these addresses are on people's rate notices. Residents need to change their address to the correct address with government agencies and service providers.

### **Road Sealing works**
